

**RIFFARRICA** (formerly known as Duo Malva & Priks) started in 2016. Kulno Malva and Kristjan Priks, both experienced folk musicians, joined forces to make vigorous and masculine folk music, drawing inspiration from centuries-old Estonian folk tale songs.

The combination of Kulno's rasping vocals and dynamic accordion grooves - alongside the sound of Kristjan's distinctive drum set - gave birth to a fresh and exciting sound: "Folk with muscle", as Baltic Music News so accurately named it.

The music is loud, sounding more like a rock concert than a traditional folk gig; it's more suited to venue stages and bigger rooms than small cafes, to give standing audiences a chance to move to the music.

## The name

RIFFARRICA first comes up in The Cosmography of Aethicus Ister from 8th century. Lennart Meri uses the name in his book Hõbevalge, when referring to the northern coast of ancient Estonia.

For us, it's a symbol of ancient Estonia and a perfect combination of riffs and arrangements of Estonian traditional folk songs.

## Songs

Riffarrica sing in the archaic language of Estonian folk songs (regilaul) that sounds like an encoded secret language. Sometimes tricky to grasp even for Estonians,



this makes them all the more exciting to listen to.

Keeping all that in mind, it's no wonder that the song themes are a bit out of ordinary compared to the songs usually played on radio nowadays. For example:

- Härg (Ox) is a bloody song about killing an ox.
- Tōbine naine (Sickly Woman) is a cautionary tale for men if you marry a young woman, then bear in mind that she'll start swelling at the waist soon!
